Penang to celebrate International Women's Day with month-long events

GEORGE TOWN: The Penang government, through the Penang Women's Development Corporation (PWDC), will launch the state-level International Women's Day 2025 celebration on Feb 27 as part of efforts to strengthen the gender equality agenda in the state.

State Social Development, Welfare and Non-Islamic Affairs Committee chairman Lim Siew Khim said with the theme 'Driving Achievement', the celebration will continue until March 31 with activities across four main components.

"This is the 13th year that Penang is celebrating the event. The first component is the opening ceremony, which will

be held simultaneously across five districts via cross live streaming, with the Northeast District as the host," she said at a press conference in Komtar here yesterday.

The event will be officiated by Chief Minister Chow Kon Yeow on Feb 27.

Lim said the second component is 'Semarak Ungu' (Purple Illumination)—an initiative to 'bathe' Penang in purple lights.

"Starting Feb 27, iconic buildings such as Komtar will be lit in purple. We also have the cooperation of Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB) to illuminate the TNB Monopole Transmission Tower in purple.

"The celebration will continue

throughout March with the third component, 'Raudhah Ilmu' (Garden of Knowledge), held in conjunction with Ramadan. It will focus on spiritual sharing sessions highlighting the involvement of Muslim women in women's empowerment efforts."

She said the final component of the celebration, 'Fiesta Ungu' (Purple Fiesta), will honour women with exciting activities such as sand sculpture displays, traditional games and a Purple Run at Feringghi Bay.

Lim emphasised that Women's Day is not just a commemorative event but a platform to recognise women's achievements in various fields, including social, economic,

cultural and political spheres. It also serves as a reminder that more efforts are needed to ensure women have equal opportunities and resources to reach their full potential.

She said in Malaysia, Department of Statistics data highlights significant gender gaps in two key areas, including political empowerment, with a score of only 0.096, indicating that women still have limited representation in politics.

"In terms of economic participation and opportunities, the score of 0.698 reflects the challenges women face in competing in the job market and business sector," she added. — Bernama

Earlier, the motion on flood and landslide disasters in Sarawak and Sabah was raised by Chiew Choon Man (PH-Miri) after the

question-and-answer session in the Dewan Rakyat, and was subsequently referred by Deputy Speaker Datuk Dr Ramli Mohd Nor for discussion in the Special Chamber.

Nancy added that the district and state disaster management committees have been instructed to ensure supplies reach the affected locations and that the involved PPS are adequately equipped with essential facilities.

"The total strength of personnel

amounts to 14,209 in Sabah and 24,757 in Sarawak, with various assets including lorries, four-wheel drive vehicles, amphibious boats, and ambulances placed in strategic locations across all districts," she said.

In addition, she said the National Disaster Management Agency (Nadma) has requested the division disaster management committees to streamline and expedite the registration process for flood victims in affected areas to prevent delays in the distribution of 'wang ehsan' (compassionate aid).

"Even though flooding is ongoing, district-level government agencies are actively working to identify household heads affected, and all eligible recipients will soon receive disaster aid from the federal government through the respective state governments," she said. — Bernama

Hadir sama, Exco Pembangunan Usahawan, Koperasi dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna negeri, Allex Seah Shoo Chin dan Timbalan Exco Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Komuniti negeri Leng Chau Yen.

Menurut Kalsom, proses perpindahan ke bangunan baharu di Kompleks CMI sebelum ini dikenali sebagai Bangunan K-Inkubator sudah mencapai 80 peratus.

“Saya difahamkan kesemua kakitangan JKM Melaka seramai 356 orang dan mereka akan berpindah secara berperingkat. Dijangka bangunan baharu ini akan memulakan operasi pada Mac iaitu selepas hari raya Aidilfitri.

Breast cancer screening rate remains critically low

➤ Misinformation, accessibility issues and cultural barriers hinder early detection: Experts

PETALING JAYA: Breast cancer screening rates in Malaysia remain critically low, not due to a decline in case but because women have been avoiding them, said Breast Cancer Welfare Association Malaysia (BCWA) public relations and partnerships manager Sumitra Selvaraj.

She said a recent Hologic Global Women's Health Index report, a multiyear global survey of women's health, revealed a worrying decline in cancer testing worldwide.

"For the first time since 2020, when the index began, only 10% of women surveyed worldwide reported being tested for any type of cancer in the past year, marking a two-percentage-point decrease from the previous two years. A woman who has never examined her breasts from the age of 20 or undergone an annual clinical breast examination is not going to be the easiest person to convince to have a mammogram once she turns 40. This is the truth," she said.

Despite these challenges, BCWA's outreach efforts are yielding results.

In 2024, the organisation conducted 7,652 free clinical breast examinations, detecting 338 abnormal findings.

"Our focus is on early detection. Screening numbers will only rise when early detection is normalised as self-care."

She said BCWA actively takes mobile clinics to underserved areas and collaborates with local leaders to address cultural sensitivities.

Another major hurdle is misinformation, with many women believing they are not at risk if they do not have a family history of breast cancer, but Sumitra debunked this.

"A staggering majority of breast cancer cases occur sporadically, with only 10% to 20% linked to family history."

National Cancer Society Malaysia (NCSM) assistant director (medical) Dr Ruthresh Rao Subramanyam said other cancer screenings among women face similar challenges.

"The NCSM is working with the Health Ministry to develop a national database to

track screenings across NGO, private hospitals and public healthcare facilities.

"In rural areas where healthcare facilities and trained personnel are scarce, accessibility remains a major barrier. Long waiting times and travel costs further discourage women from getting tested," he said, adding that many are unaware of free or subsidised screenings, leading to missed opportunities for early detection.

Ruthresh also highlighted misconceptions and stigma around reproductive health that prevent many women from seeking screenings.

"In some households, patriarchal norms place men as the decision-makers regarding healthcare. There have been cases where women do not seek screenings because of their husband's disapproval."

He said NCSM's national screening efforts indicate that participation is lowest in the east coast states and Sabah and Sarawak.

To address this, several initiatives have been launched to improve accessibility and awareness.

The "Leaving No One Behind" campaign, supported by corporate sponsors, offers free human papillomavirus vaccines to help eliminate cervical cancer. It has benefited about 300,000 Malaysians.

In October 2024, the *Pink Etiqa* campaign provided free mammograms to over 6,000 women through mobile clinics nationwide.

In 2023, NCSM conducted over 120,000 screenings and reached more than a million people with awareness campaigns.

"We have also partnered with Gene Solutions for multi-cancer early detection tests and worked with AstraZeneca on post-pandemic awareness campaigns. Government-backed mobile clinics help bring screenings to rural communities," he said.

Ruthresh emphasised the importance of early detection and shared a story of a woman from rural Pahang who was diagnosed with Stage 2 breast cancer during a community screening. With immediate treatment, she has remained cancer-free for five years.

"This is why screenings matter. When detected early, cancer is treatable," he said.

He urged women to prioritise regular screenings as an essential part of self-care from the age of 20 and undergo an annual clinical breast examination. Those interested can reach out for support and guidance.

theSun reached out to the Health Ministry several times between Jan 30 and yesterday for the latest statistics on cancer cases among women, but has yet to receive a response as of press time.

Elder abuse a ticking time bomb

Rise in mistreatment of seniors needs immediate solutions, say experts

PETALING JAYA: While respect and care for the elderly are fundamental in Asian traditions, disturbing cases of elder abuse challenge this notion.

Two years ago, in Sungai Besi, a man in his 60s was found near death after being abandoned at a cemetery by a family member. Starved and dehydrated, he survived for days by consuming his own waste before dying in hospital.

In Kepong, several years earlier, an octogenarian was forced to live in her yard after her son, angered by her asset distribution among siblings, drove her out. A kind stranger eventually took her to a shelter.

Last year in Kedah, a couple in their 60s, who had supported their son, his wife and a newborn, were kicked out from their own home. The son, allegedly influenced by his wife, sent them to Kuala Lumpur on a bus, leaving them destitute and forcing them to survive on the streets.

These stories highlight a growing and distressing trend of neglect and abuse against the elderly, who deserve care and respect.

Social activist and philanthropist Kuan Chee Heng, who operates a free ambulance service in the Klang Valley and is deeply committed to helping the elderly, has witnessed countless cases of seniors being stripped of their savings and heartlessly abandoned by their families or caregivers.

Having assisted hundreds of abandoned elderly individuals over the past decade, the charity worker warns that without swift and effective action by the government, the country could soon face an ageing population crisis.

"I am sickened by these cases, and it makes me really sad to see these abuses occurring regularly. It is time for us to protect the aged

with a law that compels their families to care for them and penalises those who neglect them," Kuan said, adding that the country direly needs to pass the Senior Citizens Bill.

In 2023, Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri said the Senior Citizens Bill, aimed at safeguarding the rights and well-being of the elderly, has been drafted.

The Bill is expected to include provisions for legal action and penalties against adult children who neglect their responsibilities toward their parents.

Additionally, the Bill seeks to protect the rights and well-being of senior citizens and empower the elderly community.

According to Kuan, the nation is facing situations where both parents and their children are in their golden years.

"Living past 70, they have exhausted their savings and have children who have a family of their own to care for and are struggling themselves to make

ends meet," he said.

Kuan suggested the government work closely with corporations and religious and charitable organisations to develop shelters for old folks at existing venues that are underutilised.

"Many temples have large compounds, and this can be used to house them. Government-run vocational training should also include courses that specialise in the management of the elderly, and these graduates can be tasked to take charge of these centres," he said.

Experts studying the challenges of the ageing population emphasise the need for legal, social and ethical solutions.

"Strengthening the rights of the aged, providing financial protections combined with social support and awareness is key to addressing this growing crisis," said psychologist and counsellor Assoc Prof Dr Fauziah Mohd Saad of Universiti Pendidikan Sultan Idris (UPSI).

She said diminished mental

capacity due to conditions such as dementia or Alzheimer's disease impairs an individual's decision-making abilities, rendering them easy targets and highly susceptible to abuse by close family members or caregivers.

"Seniors who live alone or are dependent on a limited number of individuals for support may be subjected to abuse, as such isolation makes it easier for exploiters to manipulate them without interference.

"Financial abuse can also occur as a result of strained relationships, greed or a 'sense of entitlement'. Children or relatives may take advantage and plunder an elder's savings and assets, sometimes justifying it as inheritance in advance," she said, as elderly individuals could place unconditional trust in family members or caregivers.

Fauziah advised that seniors, with the assistance of trusted family members, should take proactive steps to protect their savings and assets, especially when

experiencing cognitive decline. She said setting up a trust or will with clear legal guidelines can prevent unauthorised transfer of assets.

"Assigning the power of attorney to a trustworthy person ensures financial decisions are made in their best interest. Instead of relying on a single family member, there should be several other individuals they trust or can rely on to assist and guide them, making sure they do not make decisions under duress. Instilling awareness on scams and manipulation will also help them safeguard their assets," Fauziah said.

She emphasised the need for elderly individuals to have an easy way to report abuse without fearing repercussions or retaliation, adding that authorities should actively promote helplines and provide dedicated legal aid.

She said a more effective approach could involve establishing a government-monitored support fund for neglected seniors and implementing laws that impose penalties for elder neglect, including financial restitution.

"In some countries, those who abandon their elderly parents have their names published. Although it is controversial, it can serve as a deterrent. Social pensions and public housing for abandoned old folks should also be considered," Fauziah said.

Prof Dr Intan Hashimah Mohd Hashim of Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) said developing positive relationships within a family could also instil compassion and empathy among younger members.

"Elderly abuse is less likely to occur in a family where its members are kind and considerate with each other. Caregivers should also receive emotional support because they may suffer stress and burnout, which are two factors that often lead to abuse of senior folks," the psychologist said.

Hapus stigma terhadap OKU mental

Insiden menyayat hati individu orang kurang upaya (OKU) mental dibelasah di sebuah pasar di Pantai Timur pada 17 Januari lalu, mengundang pelbagai reaksi masyarakat.

Ia bukan sahaja mencerminkan kurangnya kesedaran terhadap hak asasi golongan OKU, bahkan mengetengahkan cabaran besar dalam membentuk masyarakat lebih inklusif dan berperikemanusiaan.

Hakikatnya, OKU mental adalah sebahagian daripada komuniti kita yang memerlukan perlindungan, empati dan sokongan berterusan. Mereka menghadapi kekangan dalam pemikiran, emosi atau tingkah laku akibat masalah kesihatan mental dengan antara kategori penyakit adalah skizofrenia, bipolar dan gangguan psikotik.

Mengikut laporan Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM), lebih 50,000 individu OKU mental berdaftar sehingga 2023, namun jumlah mungkin lebih tinggi kerana stigma sosial sering menjadi halangan utama kepada pendaftaran dan akses kepada rawatan.

Golongan ini tidak meminta dilahirkan berbeza, sebaliknya apa mereka perlukan hanyalah ruang untuk hidup dengan bermaruah serta peluang mencapai potensi sepenuhnya tanpa diskriminasi. Sering kali, ketidaktahuan masyarakat menjadi punca salah faham dan diskriminasi terhadap OKU mental.

Contoh, apabila mereka menunjukkan tingkah laku luar biasa, masyarakat kerap kali bertindak agresif tanpa memahami punca sebenar. Hakikatnya, tindakan agresif OKU mental lazimnya berpunca daripada simptom penyakit yang mereka alami, bukan keinginan mencederakan orang lain.

Sebagai langkah pertama, masyarakat perlu empati dan melihat situasi dari perspektif mereka dengan memberi ruang dan tidak membuat provokasi.

Jika berlaku sesuatu insiden di tempat awam, elak guna kekerasan, sebaliknya hubungi pihak berkuasa atau ahli keluarga mereka untuk mendapatkan bantuan.

Fahami simptom penyakit mental

Masyarakat perlu faham simptom penyakit mental supaya lebih bersedia menghadapi sebarang situasi.

Selain itu, keluarga adalah tonggak utama dalam menjaga kestabilan emosi OKU mental. Pemantauan rawatan, sesi terapi dan sokongan moral keluarga memainkan peranan penting dalam membantu pesakit menjalani kehidupan lebih baik.

Komuniti juga mempunyai tanggungjawab menyediakan sokongan diperlukan. Misalnya, program komuniti seperti kaunseling berkelompok dan aktiviti pemulihan boleh meningkatkan keyakinan diri golongan ini.

Kerajaan juga sudah menggubal beberapa perundangan untuk melindungi hak OKU, termasuk Akta OKU 2008 dan Akta Kesihatan Mental 2001. Malaysia turut meratifikasi Konvensyen PBB Mengenai Hak OKU (CRPD) pada 2010, sebagai tanda komitmen kepada perlindungan hak golongan ini.

Bagaimanapun, pelaksanaan dasar ini memerlukan usaha lebih gigih, terutama dalam menangani isu keganasan terhadap OKU mental. Mengikut Kanun Keseksaan Seksyen 323, perbuatan mencederakan individu OKU boleh dikenakan tindakan undang-undang.

Namun, kesedaran masyarakat terhadap perlindungan ini masih kurang dan perlu diperkukuh melalui pendidikan serta kempen kesedaran lebih menyeluruh. Menghapuskan stigma terhadap OKU mental adalah cabaran terbesar dalam perjuangan untuk memastikan mereka diiktiraf sebagai sebahagian masyarakat.

Langkah penting perlu diambil, antaranya pendidikan awam, iaitu kempen kesedaran berterusan mendidik masyarakat mengenai kepentingan sokongan kepada OKU mental.

Pembabit persatuan komuniti dan organisasi tempatan dalam membantu proses rehabilitasi, selain pengukuhan undang-undang perlu untuk memastikan perlindungan lebih menyeluruh golongan ini daripada keganasan dan diskriminasi.

OKU mental memerlukan sokongan semua untuk hidup dengan bermaruah. Tindakan kecil seperti menunjukkan empati atau mendidik diri sendiri terhadap penyakit mental boleh memberikan impak besar dalam membentuk masyarakat lebih inklusif.

Banjir di Bintulu hampir pulih, beberapa kawasan masih dipantau - Bomba

BINTULU: Keadaan banjir yang melanda Bintulu sejak seminggu lalu kini hampir pulih sepenuhnya.

Ketua Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia (JBPM) Zon 5 Bintulu, Wan Kamarudin Wan Ahmad berkata, bagaimanapun, masih terdapat beberapa kawasan yang dalam pemantauan pihaknya.

"Antara kawasan yang masih dipantau ialah Kampung Jepak dan Kampung Kemunting," katanya kepada Bernama.

Menurutnya, beberapa lokasi masih perlu dipantau kerana berisiko mengalami runtuh rumah akibat banjir, manakala kawasan lain telah surut sepenuhnya.

Mengulas mengenai bencana banjir yang bermula di Bintulu pada 29 Jan lepas, Wan Kamarudin berkata sebanyak 48 lokasi di sekitar bandar itu yang terkesan akibat banjir.

Katanya, selain membantu memindahkan penduduk yang terjejas, JBPM Bintulu turut melaksanakan misi penghantaran bekalan makanan kepada mangsa di kawasan pedalaman yang terputus hubungan.

Wan Kamarudin yang juga anak jati Bintulu menyifatkan, bencana kali ini sebagai yang paling buruk pernah melanda bandar itu.

"Seumur hidup saya di sini, inilah banjir paling teruk. Malah, kawasan Jepak yang sebelum ini jarang dilanda banjir turut terjejas kali ini," katanya.

Siasatan awal mendapati, wanita berkenaan mengaku terabit dengan kejadian itu.

Suspek berusia 63 tahun dibawa ke Mahkamah Majistret Jasin pada Rabu untuk permohonan perintah reman.

JASIN - Seorang warga emas direman tujuh hari bagi membantu siasatan berhubung kes amang seksual fizikal terhadap cucu perempuannya, lima tahun lalu.

Perintah reman terhadap suspek lelaki berusia 63 tahun yang merupakan pesara pegawai veterinar sehingga Selasa ini dikeluarkan Majistret Mazana Sinin pada Rabu.

Suspek yang memakai baju lokap ungu tiba di pekarangan Mahkamah Majistret di sini, menaiki trak polis kira-kira 9 jam pagi.

Sumber berkata, mangsa ketika kejadian berusia tujuh tahun mendakwa dicabul semasa dia dan ibu bapanya tinggal bersama suspek kerana ketika itu isteri suspek menunaikan umrah.

Menurutnya, insiden yang berlaku pada 2020 itu hanya diketahui pada 29 Januari lalu apabila ibu saudara kanak-kanak itu yang berusia 50-an bertanyakan pengalamannya tinggal bersama suspek ketika mangsa berusia tujuh tahun.

Katanya, kanak-kanak itu mendakwa dicabul datuknya dan diugut akan dipukul sekiranya menceritakan kejadian itu kepada sesiapa termasuk ibu bapanya berusia 30-an.

Kes disiasat mengikut Seksyen 14(a) Akta Kesalahan-Kesalahan Seksual Terhadap Kanak-Kanak (AKSTK) 2017.

Nafi noda janda anak 3 dalam lori

Batu Pahat: Pemandu lori, Mohd Norhisyamudin Jamaludin, 44, mengaku tidak bersalah atas dua pertuduhan merogol dan melakukan persetubuhan luar tabii terhadap janda anak tiga di dalam kenderaan itu, bulan lalu.

Mohd Norhisyamudin membuat pengakuan itu selepas kesemua pertuduhan dikemukakan jurubahasa di hadapan Hakim Osman Affendi Mohd Shalleh.

Bagi pertuduhan pertama, bapa tiga anak itu didakwa merogol janda berusia 43 tahun dalam lori diparkir di Taman Kota, Yong Peng, dekat sini, antara jam 7.39 malam hingga jam 8.30 malam, 28 Januari lalu.

Dia didakwa mengikut Seksyen 376 (1) Kanun Keseksan membawa hukuman penjara sehingga 20 tahun dan juga sebatan.

Bagi pertuduhan kedua, dia didakwa dengan sengaja melakukan persetubuhan bertentangan aturan tabii terhadap mangsa yang mana kejadian ini juga berlaku pada tarikh, waktu dan lokasi sama.

Dia didakwa mengikut

Seksyen 377C Kanun Keseksan yang memperuntukkan hukuman penjara antara lima hingga 20 tahun serta sebatan, jika sabit kesalahan.

Berdasarkan laporan dibuat, kejadian berlaku ketika mangsa mahu menghantar makanan kepada tertuduh.

Namun, pada hari kejadian, cuaca tidak baik yang mana tertuduh mengajak mangsa masuk ke dalam lori sementara menanti hujan reda.

Kesempatan itu diambil tertuduh melakukan perbuatan terbabit terhadap mangsa walaupun wanita itu cuba melawan, namun tidak diendahkan.

Mangsa membuat laporan di Balai Polis Yong Peng pada hari kejadian dengan tertuduh ditahan keesokan harinya.

Pendakwaan dikendalikan Timbalan Pendakwa Raya Sharifah Natasha Syed Ahmad manakala tertuduh tidak diwakili peguam.

Tertuduh diikat jamin RM10,000 dan mahkamah menetapkan 5 Mac ini untuk serahan dokumen serta lantikan peguam.

Bapa tidak mengaku rogol anak kandung

TELUK INTAN: Seorang lelaki dihadapkan ke Mahkamah Sesyen di sini hari ini atas tuduhan merogol anak perempuannya dalam kejadian di sebuah rumah di Changkat Jong, November lalu.

Tertuduh berusia 57 tahun itu bagaimanapun mengaku tidak bersalah selepas pertuduhan dibacakan jurubahasa di hadapan Hakim Norhamizah Shaiffuddin.

Mengikut pertuduhan, lelaki itu didakwa telah merogol mangsa yang ketika itu berusia 21 tahun di mana perhubungan tersebut tidak dibenarkan di bawah undang-undang, hukum agama, adat dan kebiasaan yang terpakai untuk berkahwin.

Perbuatan itu dilakukan tertuduh di sebuah rumah di Kampung Baru Changkat Jong, Teluk Intan dalam daerah Hilir Perak pada pukul 12.30 malam, November 2024.

Bagi kesalahan itu, tertuduh didakwa mengikut Seksyen 376 (3) Kanun Keseksaan yang membawa hukuman penjara minimum lapan tahun dan maksimum 30 tahun serta tidak lebih 10 sebatan jika disabitkan kesalahan.

Timbalan Pendakwa Raya, Azalea Sharmeen Zaizan mencadangkan jaminan sebanyak RM15,000 berserta syarat tambahan tertuduh tidak dibenarkan mengganggu mangsa dan saksi pendakwaan sehingga kes selesai selain melaporkan diri di balai polis terdekat setiap bulan.

Bagaimanapun, tertuduh yang tidak diwakili peguam memohon jaminan dikurangkan atas alasan bekerja kampung dengan mengambil upah memotong buah kepala sawit dan meraih pendapatan bulanan sebanyak RM300.

Mahkamah kemudian membenarkan tertuduh diikat jamin sebanyak RM10,000 dengan seorang penjamin selain syarat tambahan yang dikemukakan pihak pendakwaan.

Tarikh sebutan semula kes ditetapkan pada 7 Mac depan.

Media sebelum ini melaporkan, perbuatan keji seorang bapa yang disyaki melakukan sumbang mahram ke atas anak perempuannya sejak 10 tahun lalu terbongkar apabila lelaki terbabit ditangkap polis pada 22 Januari lalu.

Lelaki itu diberkas susulan laporan polis dibuat mangsa yang turut mendakwa diugut suspek supaya tidak mendedahkan kejadian menimpa dirinya kepada sesiapa. - UTUSAN
