Assalamualaikum Warahmatullahi Wabarakatuh and a very good morning.

 It is with great honour and pleasure that I say Selamat Datang, welcome to Kuala Lumpur and to the 2025 ASEAN Women, Peace and Security Summit.

8. This Summit offers us more than discussion. It is a platform to listen to one another, to share practical lessons, and to build the solidarity we need to move forward as a region.

So once again, on behalf of the Ministry, I warmly welcome all who are present here today, to this Summit. I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the Prime Minister of Malaysia for his leadership in this WPS agenda, the Deputy Prime Minister who is present today in gracing this occasion. I extend my deepest appreciation to the ASEAN Secretariat, our ASEAN partners – Australia, Canada, New Zealand, UK, UN Women, colleagues, and collaborators for making this event possible.

10. On that note, let us work together to ensure that peace in our region is not only inclusive but sustainable, not only resilient but meaningful in the lives of our people.
