KUALA LUMPUR, 26 Oktober –Isteri Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Dr. Wan Azizah Wan Ismail, meninjau persiapan akhir Program Pasangan Ketua-Ketua Negara dan Kerajaan ASEAN sempena Sidang Kemuncak ASEAN ke-47 yang akan berlangsung esok di Carcosa Seri Negara.

Walkabout itu turut disertai oleh Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat, Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri, yang bersama-sama meninjau perjalanan persiapan program, termasuk susun atur meja, dekorasi, aktiviti dan persediaan protokol bagi menyambut tetamu kehormat dari negara anggota ASEAN.

TASEK GELUGOR, 26 Oktober - Penyelarasan bantuan kepada penduduk terjejas banjir di Pulau Pinang berada pada tahap terbaik.

Ia hasil kerjasama pelbagai agensi termasuk Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM), Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) dan Angkatan Pertahanan Awam (APM).

Timbalan Ketua Menteri I Pulau Pinang, Datuk Dr Mohamad Abdul Hamid berkata, pengalaman berdepan bencana sebelum ini membantu memperkukuh pengurusan dan koordinasi di semua peringkat.

"Semua dalam keadaan terurus melibatkan pejabat daerah di kawasan Seberang Perai Utara, Seberang Perai Tengah dan Barat Daya.

"Penyelarasan berjalan dengan baik kerana kita sudah pernah menghadapi situasi seperti ini, jadi ia bukan sesuatu yang baharu. Alhamdulillah, dalam tempoh tiga hari ini pengurusan berada dalam keadaan baik," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian selepas menyantuni penduduk terjejas banjir di Pusat Pemindahan Sementara (PPS) Sekolah Kebangsaan Lahar Yooi.

PPS tersebut menempatkan seramai 377 individu daripada 106 keluarga.

Kuala Lumpur: Keadaan banjir di Perak, Kedah dan Pulau Pinang beransur pulih apabila jumlah mangsa berkurangan kepada 3,523 orang berbanding 5,850 orang pagi tadi, berikutan penutupan beberapa pusat pemindahan sementara (PPS).

Di **PERAK**, sebanyak 27 PPS masih beroperasi manakala satu PPS di Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Kampung Dew di Kerian telah ditutup setakat 4 petang ini, menurut Sekretariat Jawatankuasa Pengurusan Bencana Negeri (JPBN) Perak.

Menurut kenyataan itu, jumlah mangsa banjir di empat daerah iaitu Larut Matang Selama (LMS), Manjung, Kerian dan Perak Tengah, berkurangan kepada 1,339 orang daripada 437 keluarga berbanding 2,467 orang daripada 831 keluarga sebelum ini.

LMS merekodkan pengurangan jumlah mangsa kepada 555 orang berbanding 1,694 orang di 19 PPS, manakala di Manjung pula jumlah mangsa menurun sedikit kepada 531 orang berbanding 541 orang di lima PPS.

Bagi daerah Kerian, sebanyak 143 mangsa masih berlindung di tiga PPS manakala 110 mangsa kekal berada di sebuah PPS di Perak Tengah.

Di **KEDAH**, jumlah mangsa banjir menurun kepada 1,335 orang daripada 381 keluarga berbanding 1,934 orang daripada 602 keluarga pagi tadi, melibatkan mangsa di lima daerah yang ditempatkan di sembilan PPS.

JPBN Kedah memaklumkan 10 PPS telah ditutup petang ini manakala daerah Kulim kekal dengan jumlah mangsa tertinggi iaitu 890 orang daripada 252 keluarga di lima PPS, diikuti Pendang dengan 279 orang daripada 74 keluarga di satu PPS.

"Pokok Sena pula merekodkan 124 mangsa daripada 37 keluarga di satu PPS, satu PPS di Kubang Pasu (23 mangsa, 11 keluarga) manakala 19 mangsa daripada tujuh keluarga masih berlindung di satu PPS," menurut kenyataan itu.

Sementara itu, laman sesawang Public Infobanjir memaklumkan empat sungai di Kedah melepasi paras bahaya iaitu Sungai Pendang di Pendang (3.54 meter), Sungai Laka di Kubang Pasu (21.61m), Sungai Titi Kerbau di Pendang (6.7m) dan Sungai Padang Terap di Kubang Pasu (4.21m).

Di **PULAU PINANG**, satu-satunya PPS di Daerah Barat Daya iaitu Sekolah Kebangsaan (SK) Tan Sri Awang Had Salleh, yang menempatkan 34 orang daripada 10 keluarga pagi tadi, telah ditutup petang ini.

Menurut portal Info Bencana Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM) setakat 3.57 petang, jumlah mangsa banjir di Pulau Pinang menurun kepada 849 orang daripada 233 keluarga di enam PPS berbanding 1,049 orang daripada 292 keluarga di tujuh PPS pagi tadi.

Daerah Seberang Perai Utara (SPU) kekal mencatat jumlah mangsa tertinggi dengan 615 orang daripada 165 keluarga ditempatkan di empat PPS iaitu SK Lahar Yooi (291 orang), SK Padang Menora (120 orang), Sekolah Agama Rakyat Nylor Sebatang (85 orang) dan Pusat Pemindahan Labuh Banting (119 orang).

Di Seberang Perai Tengah, 193 orang daripada 58 keluarga ditempatkan di SK Guar Perahu, manakala 41 orang daripada 10 keluarga berada di Sekolah Menengah Kebangsaan (SMK) Permatang Pasir.

Keadaan cuaca yang semakin baik dan cerah menyebabkan banjir di beberapa kawasan mulai surut serta membolehkan penduduk pulang ke rumah masing-masing.

Mangsa banjir di utara semenanjung meningkat kepada 3,473 orang

PETALING JAYA – Jumlah mangsa banjir di tiga negeri utara semenanjung meningkat kepada 3,473 orang setakat pukul 5.30 petang tadi.

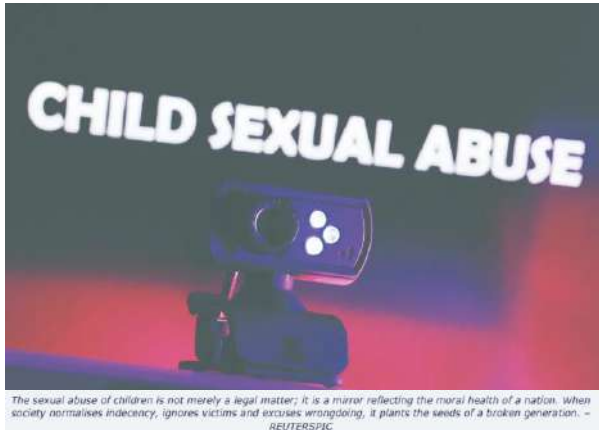
Menurut laporan terkini Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat (JKM), sebanyak 37 pusat pemindahan sementara (PPS) dibuka bagi menempatkan 1,023 keluarga yang terjejas di Kedah, Pulau Pinang dan Perak.

“Kedah mencatatkan jumlah tertinggi dengan 1,446 mangsa daripada 407 keluarga di lima daerah terlibat. Diikuti Perak dengan 1,178 mangsa daripada 383 keluarga manakala Pulau Pinang merekodkan 849 mangsa daripada 233 keluarga,” katanya

Data juga menunjukkan mangsa terdiri daripada 1,180 wanita dewasa, 1,139 lelaki dewasa, 1,077 kanak-kanakserta 77 bayi. Selain itu, terdapat 419 warga emas dan 68 orang kurang upaya (OKU) yang turut dipindahkan. – KOSMO! ONLINE.

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When children become victims and perpetrators

MALAYSIA is facing a moral and social crisis of growing proportions as the number of sexual abuse cases involving children and adolescents continues to rise.

What was once perceived as isolated incidents has now evolved into a disturbing national pattern that regularly dominates headlines.

Even more unsettling is that the perpetrators are no longer only adults but also increasingly children themselves. This reality reflects not just a decline in moral values but also the weakening of the systems designed to safeguard our nation's most vulnerable – our children. According to police data, 5,401 cases of sexual crimes involving minors were recorded in 2023, a figure that exposes the disturbing prevalence of exploitation and abuse.

Between January and April 2024 alone, authorities documented 2,059 sexual crime cases against children, indicating that such cases are neither declining nor confined to specific states. They are spreading across communities, schools and even family circles.

The Social Welfare Department further reported that as of mid-2025, there were 1,260 sexual abuse cases involving minors, making it the largest category of child abuse recorded in the country. Experts warn that these numbers only represent reported cases while countless others remain hidden due to fear, shame or manipulation by perpetrators.

Sexual abuse is not merely an act of physical violence; it is a violation that destroys a child's innocence, trust and sense of safety. It leaves scars that do not fade – psychological trauma, depression, loss of confidence and fear that can persist into adulthood.

Some victims struggle to rebuild their lives while others carry invisible wounds that shape their relationships, education and mental well-being for years to come.

Even more tragic is that many of these acts occur in spaces meant to nurture and protect, such as homes, schools and religious institutions. When the very places entrusted with moral and emotional safety become the setting of harm, it signals that something fundamental in our society has gone terribly wrong.

Equally troubling is the emergence of children and adolescents as perpetrators. Psychosocial research reveals that many of these young offenders were once victims themselves, exposed to pornography or sexual abuse from a young age.

Without moral supervision, parental guidance or religious grounding, they imitate what they consume from digital platforms that glorify sex, dominance and violence.

In some cases, both victim and perpetrator are minors, eroding the line between innocence and culpability. When society fails to teach respect, consent and self-restraint, children learn distorted lessons from their screens instead of from their parents, teachers and faith.

This moral decay cannot be dismissed as an individual failing; it is a systemic issue rooted in multiple layers, including inadequate moral and value-based education, poor parental engagement and the widespread taboo surrounding open conversations about sexual safety and respect.

Many schools continue to avoid teaching topics such as sexual exploitation, consent and online safety, viewing them as uncomfortable or inappropriate.

Meanwhile, digital exposure is nearly limitless, yet moral literacy remains minimal. Parents, overwhelmed by work and distracted by technology themselves, often assume that moral education is the school's responsibility, forgetting that a child's character is first shaped at home.

When both school and home fail to act, social media and entertainment fill the void, often with destructive consequences.

The impact of sexual abuse is devastating. Victims often suffer long-term mental health problems, including post-traumatic stress disorder and suicidal tendencies.

The erosion of trust in adults and institutions creates a generation living in quiet fear. This is not merely a criminal issue but a moral emergency that undermines the credibility of our schools, religious institutions and family systems, which are the pillars of national integrity and compassion.

Malaysia is not without legal protection. The Sexual Offences Against Children Act 2017, the Child Act 2001 and provisions under the Penal Code provide clear legal frameworks for justice. However, laws without enforcement are meaningless.

Every offender, regardless of age or status, must face the consequences of their actions. Rehabilitation for juvenile offenders is essential but accountability must remain uncompromised.

Institutions that fail to protect victims must also be held responsible. The era of concealing wrongdoing to protect reputations must end. Silence and denial only perpetuate the cycle of abuse.

Beyond the courtroom, the battle must begin in the classroom and the home. Value-based sexual education must no longer be treated as optional or controversial. It is not about teaching physical intimacy but about instilling self-respect, boundaries, dignity and empathy. The Quran emphasises in Surah An-Nur, verses 30 and 31: "Tell the believing men to lower their gaze and guard their chastity, and tell the believing women to lower their gaze and guard their modesty." These verses remind us that the foundation of morality begins with discipline, respect and personal responsibility, values that must be nurtured from a young age. Parents are the first guardians of their children's safety. They must actively monitor digital exposure, cultivate open communication and teach their children to distinguish between safe and unsafe behaviour.

Communities must reject the culture of silence that protects abusers under the guise of preserving family honour. To remain silent is to be complicit. The Prophet Muhammad, peace be upon him, said: "Every one of you is a shepherd and every one of you will be held accountable for his flock," as narrated by al-Bukhari and Muslim. Protecting children is not just a moral obligation but a sacred trust.

The sexual abuse of children is not merely a legal matter; it is a mirror reflecting the moral health of a nation. When society normalises indecency, ignores victims and excuses wrongdoing, it plants the seeds of a broken generation.

Addressing this crisis requires courage – the courage to confront uncomfortable truths, to educate with honesty and to act with integrity. Failure to do so will not only destroy individual lives but also erode the moral foundation upon which our nation stands. The safety and future of Malaysia's children depend on the choices we make today.

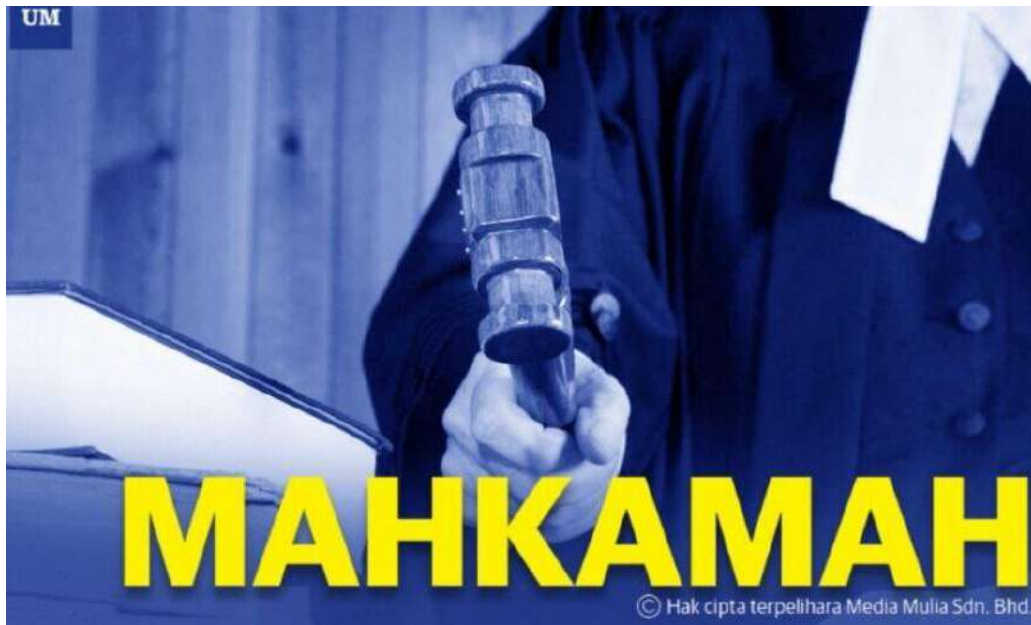

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Buruh tidak mengaku amang seksual anak tiri

KOTA BHARU: Seorang buruh mengaku tidak bersalah di Mahkamah Sesyen di sini, hari ini atas tiga pertuduhan melakukan amang seksual fizikal terhadap remaja perempuan yang merupakan anak tirinya di rumah mereka di Pasir Puteh, dekat sini pada 2023 dan April lalu.

Tertuduh berusia 54 tahun membuat pengakuan itu di hadapan Hakim Zulkifli Abllah selepas ketiga-tiga pertuduhan yang dibacakan oleh jurubahasa mahkamah.

Mengikut ketiga-tiga pertuduhan, tertuduh didakwa melakukan amang seksual fizikal terhadap seorang remaja perempuan yang berusia 15 tahun dan 17 tahun di sebuah rumah di Pasir Puteh dekat sini pada 2023 dan pukul 9 pagi, 11 April lalu.

Tertuduh didakwa mengikut Seksyen 14 (b), Seksyen 14 (c) dan Seksyen 14 (d) Akta Kesalahan-Kesalahan Seksual Terhadap Kanak-Kanak 2017 (Akta 792).

Ketiga-tiga seksyen itu boleh dihukum mengikut Seksyen 14 akta sama dan dibaca bersama Seksyen 16 (1) akta tersebut yang memperuntukkan hukuman penjara sehingga 20 tahun dan sebat jika disabitkan kesalahan.

Pendakwaan dikendalikan oleh Timbalan Pendakwa Raya, Siti Hajar Mazlan manakala tertuduh tidak diwakili peguam.

Terdahulu, Siti Hajar tidak mencadangkan jaminan kepada tertuduh kerana ketiga-tiga pertuduhan yang dihadapinya merupakan kes serius.

Mahkamah tidak membenarkan tertuduh diikat jamin selain menetapkan 25 November ini untuk sebutan semula kes. – **UTUSAN**
