Child protections strengthened

Policy addresses host of Internet-related dangers

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia has strengthened child protection rights and measures against online sexual exploitation through the National Child Policy and the National Child Action Plan (2026-2030), says Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi.

The Deputy Prime Minister said the updated policy reinforces safeguards against grooming, cyberbullying, sexual exploitation and emotional harm.

Some key actions include legal literacy campaigns on children's rights, simplified registration for welfare homes and Internet safety awareness initiatives for teachers, students and parents.

"This policy is also designed to respond to current challenges, including the risks of violence, neglect, exploitation, mental

health concerns, the digital divide and online safety threats faced by children," Ahmad Zahid said during the opening ceremony of the 2025 Asean ICT Forum on Child Protection and the launch of the policy here yesterday.

Also present was Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri.

Ahmad Zahid said the launch marks a transformation of the child protection system, complementing existing frameworks and serving as an overarching policy to create a safe environment for children's development.

According to the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC), there were around 9,000 cyberbullying complaints in 2024, with an average of 27 cases per day.

Ahmad Zahid said this issue needed local initiatives and regional collaboration.

"Online harm has no borders; a single harmful post can reach 11 Asean countries in minutes.

"Based on research, nearly 70% of parents in Asean remain unaware of the digital risks their children face," he added.

Ahmad Zahid also outlined three strategic priorities for protecting children in the digital sphere.

He said Malaysia calls for an Asean Child Protection Information Exchange Network, which enables faster alerts, shared data and coordinated cross-border responses to online threats.

Ahmad Zahid also said that

Malaysia proposes a Shared Digital Forensics Protocol to speed up investigations and harmonise evidence-sharing.

He said it would prevent offenders exploiting jurisdictional loopholes, adding that Malaysia recommends an Asean Digital Guardianship Curriculum as a unified module for schools.

Ahmad Zahid noted that it would build digital resilience, ethical awareness and online safety skills from an early age.

At a press conference, Nancy revealed that the Anti-Bullying Bill is expected to be tabled in the current Parliament sitting.

She also said the ministry is strengthening its policies on online bullying and sexual harassment.

"For children who are targeted online, cases can still be brought before the Sexual Harassment Tribunal, and this includes offences committed in digital spaces.

"We have already handled at least one such case involving a child," she said.

Stepping it up to protect our kids

Malaysia outlines 16 strategic priorities to strengthen child protection in digital environment, says minister

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia has emphasised the implementation of 141 actions under 16 strategic priorities outlined in the National Child Policy and Action Plan (2026-2030) to strengthen child protection in the digital environment.

Minister of Women, Family and Community Development, Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri, said the newly-launched action plan would provide a clear direction towards restoring and enhancing children's rights, particularly those at risk, within a safe, inclusive, and resilient environment.

Technological advancements offer opportunities, but also increase risks, such as cyberbullying, exploitation, online predators, and emotional threats to children.

"Digital challenges extend beyond national borders, so it is essential for us to collaborate, share best practices, and build a secure digital ecosystem across the region," she told the media after officiating at the Asean ICT Forum 2025 on child online protection, and the launch of the National Child Policy and Action Plan (2026-2030) yesterday.

Nancy stressed that child protection would require a coordinated effort involving families, teachers, communities, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), and the private sector.

She also pointed out that many parents and teachers were still unaware of the online risks that could jeopardise children's safety and well-being.

Commenting on the rise in online sexual exploitation cases, she noted that the trend was driven by growing awareness and the emergence of new spaces exploited by predators.

"Young people aged 15 to 24 are particularly at risk, as many of them are not engaged in education, training, or employment.

This emphasises the need

to empower children, not only to protect them but also to ensure they understand digital developments and can make safe decisions," she added.

On the two-day forum, which kicked off yesterday, Nancy said the event aimed to improve understanding among stakeholders and ensure the new policies are both relevant and effective. — Bernama

Describing regional data on cyberbullying and digital manipulation as deeply alarming, Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ahmad Zahid Hamidi says Asean must urgently act to confront surge in exploitation of minors in cyberspace.

'Alarming rise in online threats against children'

Zahid cites troubling regional data, calls for coordinated Asean measures as Msia unveils stronger child-protection policy

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia and Asean must act with urgency to confront a surge in online child exploitation that is "moving faster than our ability to respond", Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Ahmad Zahid Hamidi warned at the 2025 Asean ICT Forum on Child Online Protection yesterday.

Citing regional data, Zahid said early indicators were already "deeply alarming", pointing to findings that 74% of internet users aged 15 and above in Singapore encountered harmful content in 2024.

In Malaysia, he said, about 33% of young people reported having been bullied online, while the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission logged some 5,000 cyberbullying complaints last year - averaging more than 27 cases a day.

"These figures are not harmless. They are symptoms that our safety nets are being stretched thin."

Zahid said artificial intelligence (AI) has rapidly magnified risks by allowing predators to clone voices, create deepfakes and manipulate children's identities from anywhere in the world.

"A predator does not need a passport. A dangerous video does not stop at immigration. One harmful post can reach 11 Asean countries in minutes," he said, stressing that digital threats now travel effortlessly across borders.

To counter this, he said Malaysia is strengthening its whole-of-government approach through updated cybercrime laws, expanded digital forensics capabilities and the integration of digital literacy from early schooling.

"We must protect children without limiting their potential. We do not want to disconnect them from technology - we want to empower them to use it safely

and confidently."

Zahid also outlined three regional priorities under Malaysia's Asean Chairmanship: a cross-border child-protection information exchange network, a shared digital forensic protocol and a unified Asean digital guardianship curriculum for schools.

"These are practical and high-impact measures that can be implemented quickly. If we move with courage today, our children will inherit a digital world that strengthens them and not scars them."

Meanwhile, Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri, who launched the National Child Policy and National Child Action Plan 2025-2030, said the new roadmap establishes a clear national direction for safeguarding children's rights and wellbeing in an increasingly digital environment.

Backed by 141 actions under 16 strategic priorities, she said the policy enhances

protections against bullying, exploitation and emotional harm while boosting digital literacy, ethical technology use and resilience among children.

"This is a milestone that reflects Malaysia's commitment to ensuring every child grows up in a safe, nurturing and empowering environment."

Nancy said technology has reshaped childhood, presenting opportunities alongside risks such as grooming, misinformation and emotional fatigue in hyper-connected spaces.

"These challenges do not stop at borders and our solutions cannot stop at borders either. Protecting children requires collaboration across governments, industry, educators, communities and young people themselves."

She urged Asean to deepen cooperation through existing regional frameworks, adding that the digital future children inherit must be built with responsibility, compassion and a shared sense of duty.

Predators leveraging AI to target minors: Unicef

KUALA LUMPUR: Southeast Asia is facing an unprecedented surge of AI-driven online child exploitation and Malaysia is already showing early signs of the same high-risk patterns, Unicef said. Based on findings revealed at the 2025 Asean ICT Forum on Child Protection yesterday.

Speaking to theSun in an exclusive interview, Unicef regional adviser for child protection Rachel Harvey said Malaysia mirrors a regional trend where children are increasingly exposed to online grooming, coercion and the circulation of non-consensual images, with emerging technologies accelerating the danger.

"There is a serious situation in Asean and Malaysia is very much part of that landscape. Unicef's study shows up to one in 20 children in this region experienced online sexual abuse in the preceding year and that figure is almost certainly underreported. Children often cannot speak out."

Harvey said high internet penetration brings opportunity but also sharp increases in harm, with the most rapid shifts driven by generative AI.

"In the last six months alone, companions have learned how to sexually engage with children, initiating inappropriate conversations, requesting and sending images back."

"These systems never existed a few years ago, so the laws and safeguards designed back then simply could not imagine today's risks."

She warned that predators are no longer acting alone.

"Organised crime is using tech, using AI, using impersonation to lure children into exploitation, trafficking networks and scam centres. The risks are multiple and intersecting both online and offline."

"This is a cross-border problem. No country can solve it alone. But with shared responsibility and unified action, we can make the digital world safer for every child."

"If we act after harm occurs, it's almost too late. We need platforms, apps, games and devices designed with safety embedded from the start. Prevention-by-design is the only way this region can keep pace."

Delivering opening remarks at the event, Unicef representative to Malaysia Robert Gass said global reports of AI-generated child sexual abuse material (CSAM) spiked from nearly 7,000 in 2024 to about 440,000 cases in the first half of 2025.

"One in every four Malaysian children encounters sexual or disturbing content online unexpectedly and while AI-generated material still represents a small portion of overall cases, its growth trajectory is deeply alarming."

Gass said blocking children from the internet is not feasible.

"Children are online because the world is online. Real protection is not about cutting access - it is about ensuring the entire ecosystem safe." - By Faiz Ruzman

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia menekankan pelaksanaan 141 tindakan di bawah 16 keutamaan strategik melalui Dasar dan Pelan Tindakan Kanak-Kanak Negara 2026–2030 bagi memperkukuh perlindungan kanak-kanak dalam persekitaran digital.

Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWK) Dato Sri Nancy Shukri berkata pelan tindakan baharu itu menyediakan hala tuju jelas untuk mengembalikan dan memperkukuh hak kanak-kanak, khususnya mereka yang berisiko, dalam persekitaran selamat, inklusif dan berdaya tahan.

"Perkembangan teknologi membawa peluang, tetapi turut meningkatkan risiko seperti buli siber, eksploitasi, pemangsa dalam talian serta ancaman emosi terhadap kanak-kanak.

"Cabaran digital tidak berhenti di sempadan negara. Kita perlu bekerjasama, berkongsi amalan terbaik dan membina ekosistem digital selamat merentasi seluruh rantau," katanya kepada pemberita selepas Majlis Perasmian Forum ICT ASEAN 2025 mengenai perlindungan kanak-kanak dalam talian serta pelancaran Dasar Kanak-Kanak Negara dan Pelan Tindakan (2026–2030).

Nancy menegaskan bahawa perlindungan kanak-kanak memerlukan komitmen bersepadu melibatkan keluarga, guru, komuniti, NGO dan sektor swasta.

Beliau berkata, masih ramai ibu bapa dan guru kurang menyedari risiko dalam talian yang boleh menjejaskan keselamatan dan kesejahteraan kanak-kanak.

Mengulas peningkatan kes eksploitasi seksual dalam talian, beliau

berkata trend itu didorong oleh tahap kesedaran yang semakin meningkat selain kewujudan ruang baharu yang dimanfaatkan pemangsa.

Golongan berumur 15 hingga 24 tahun berisiko tinggi kerana sebahagian mereka berada di luar sistem pendidikan, latihan atau pekerjaan.

"Ini menekankan keperluan memperkasakan penyertaan kanak-kanak supaya mereka bukan sahaja dilindungi, tetapi juga memahami perkembangan digital dan mampu membuat keputusan selamat," katanya.

Sementara itu, mengenai forum dua hari yang bermula semalam, Nancy berkata penganjurannya bertujuan meningkatkan kefahaman pihak berkaitan dan memastikan dasar baharu relevan serta efektif. — Bernama

ALARMING RISE IN CASES

It's because of better awareness and the fact that predators have more chances to target children

ONLINE child sexual abuse cases in the country have increased to an alarming level and are believed to have surpassed the previously reported figure of 100,000 cases in 2022.

Women, Family and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri said there were various factors involved.

"Firstly, perhaps because there is greater awareness, the reports keep coming in.

"Secondly, it may be increasing because predators now have more opportunities to target children online," she said after the opening of the 2025 Asean ICT Forum on Child Online Protection here yesterday.

The 100,000 figure was first mentioned in "Disrupting Harm in Malaysia: Evidence on Online Child Sexual Exploitation and Abuse", a report published in 2022 as part of a multi-national research project.

Citing police data, the report found that at least four per cent of Malaysian children who use the internet were subjected to online sexual abuse. When scaled to pop-

ulation size, this represented an estimated 190,000 Malaysian children who have been harmed.

United Nations Children's Fund (Unicef) reports revealed that global child sexual abuse material (CSAM) had increased by up to 125-fold this year, with many children in Malaysia reported to be highly vulnerable to exploitation.

Unicef representative to Malaysia and special representative to Brunei Robert Gass said there were about 440,000 reports globally involving CSAM in the first half of the year.

"Sexortion" cases, where children are deceived or forced into sharing intimate images and then blackmailed, are also on the rise. AI-generated images are often

used in such cases.

"We have detected that chatbots have now learned to simulate sexual conversations and generate CSAM images."

Nancy said the situation was worrying as many parents might be unaware of the dangers their children faced online and teachers also faced limitations.

"Teachers have their responsibilities, so they do not always know what is happening, especially the latest activities online."

She said some children might unknowingly expose themselves to risks, while others feel they were knowledgeable about these things.

"These children, who feel excited, become more involved in such things," she said, adding that

safeguarding children required a collective approach.

"That is why we work together not only within government, but families must also have their own awareness. The community and teachers are also very important."

Previously, Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Law and Institutional Reform) Datuk Seri Azalina Othman Said said the government was prepared to tackle offences involving the online exploitation of children.

This followed the arrest of 31 people in a nationwide crackdown on CSAM.

Op Pedo Berspadu led to the seizure of more than 880,000 CSAM and adult pornographic material in 37 raids between Sept 22 and 30.

Zahid: AI is arming child predators

KUALA LUMPUR: Artificial intelligence has allowed predators to clone voices, create deepfake images and manipulate identities, posing a serious threat to children, said Deputy Prime Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi.

He said Malaysia was already grappling with rising risks brought by advancements in AI, which has accelerated the scale and sophistication of online threats against children, making regional cooperation and stronger national safeguards more urgent than ever.

"The Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission recorded more than 11,000 cyberbullying complaints in 2024, an average of 30 cases per day," he said at the launch of the National Child Policy and National Child Action Plan 2026-2030 at the 2025 Asean ICT Forum on Child Online Protection here yesterday.

"These figures are more than just numbers. They are signals that our existing safety nets are being stretched thin."

"Online harm has no borders. A predator does not need a passport. A dangerous video does not stop at immigration. Nearly 70 per cent of parents in Asean remain unaware of the full range of digital risks their children face."

This was worrying at a time when one in every three internet users today is a child, he said.

Malaysia, he said, held firmly to one guiding principle: "We must protect children without limiting their potential."

This requires a whole-of-government effort involving ministries, regulators, educators, parents, communities and tech firms.

"One harmful post can reach 11 Asean countries in minutes. This is why Asean's collective action is not only important, it is essential."

Zahid proposed three priorities: an Asean child-protection information exchange network, a shared digital forensics protocol and an Asean digital guardianship curriculum for schools.

He said the policy strengthened safeguards against grooming, cyberbullying, sexual exploitation and emotional harm, while also empowering children through digital literacy, ethical technology use, responsible expression and resilience.

Don't be shy to talk to kids about sex, says expert

KUALA LUMPUR: Parents and guardians must speak to their children about sex and taboo topics, no matter how hard it may be.

Communications and Multimedia Content Forum of Malaysia chief executive officer Mehdi Mahmood said this was essential to safeguard children against online sexual predators.

"Parents and guardians play a huge part. We have to start talking to our kids about the so-called taboo topics, no matter how uncomfortable it might be.

"Sex, feeling sexually aroused, attention-seeking behaviour, risky online behaviour. If predators aren't shy to bring these topics up, we can't afford to be."

"Avoiding the conversation be-

cause it's awkward doesn't protect children. Equipping them does."

Media said children must be equipped with real digital skills and not merely advised against talking to strangers or be given fear-based advice.

She said law enforcement and tech companies must work hand-in-hand so cases were not lost in between jurisdictions.

"Things only change when all these pieces actually work together. There's no magic button to completely prevent online child sexual abuse. Prevention has to cover the whole ecosystem."

"Platforms need to stop treating safety like an optional upgrade and make it the default, such as age checks, tighter pri-

vacuity settings for kids, smarter detection of grooming patterns and quicker takedowns."

Child activist Datuk Dr Hartini Zaimudin said platforms must have in-built safety features for children, such as stronger age-appropriate design and default privacy protections for minors.

"We have a global tsunami of sexualised content, pornography, violence and misogyny."

"This shapes attitudes, especially among boys and young men, right before they have any healthy, rights-based sexuality education."

"Without guidance, some cross more boundaries and push those behaviours onto children."

Hartini said online offences under the Sexual Offences Against

Children Act 2017 and related laws must be treated as serious crimes.

"Sentencing guidelines must reflect the scale and lasting harm of online abuse, especially when there are hundreds or thousands of images," she said, adding that the authorities should treat organised online abuse rings as serious organised crime, with asset forfeiture and money-laundering investigations where relevant.

She said Malaysia must enhance protection for child witnesses, including remote testimony and trauma-informed procedures, to ensure cases reach conviction.

"I think perpetrators feel the risk is low and the gains are high. We have to reverse that equation."

Anti-Bullying Bill to be tabled this Parliament session, says Nancy Shukri

KUALA LUMPUR: Putrajaya will table the Anti-Bullying Bill in Parliament before the end of the current session, said Women, Family, and Community Development Minister Datuk Seri Nancy Shukri.

She praised the speed of progress on the proposed law, despite not yet being formally introduced.

"Actually, that (the bill) is very good, because it is something we are doing quickly, even though it has not yet been tabled in Parliament," Nancy said.

She was speaking to reporters at a press conference during the 2025 Asean ICT Forum on Child Online Protection today.

Nancy said the Legal Affairs Division (BHEUU) would bring the bill forward soon.

"InsyaAllah, the bill will be (tabled) before the end of the session by the Legal Affairs Division (BHEUU)," she said, adding that it will be brought up by Minister in the Prime Minister's Department (Law and Institutional Reform) Datuk Seri Azalina Othman Said.

She said the bill was designed to provide redress for a wide range of bullying cases through its proposed tribunal system, which is modeled on the Anti-Sexual Harassment Tribunal established in 2022.

"(The bill) is to cover most of the cases faced by the country, especially those involving children," she said.

Oct 23, Azalina said the tribunal to be set up under the proposed bill is expected to resolve related civil cases faster than taking them to court.

Azalina said that when bullying cases involve criminal elements, they may be referred to the police for investigation and subsequently brought to criminal court for prosecution.

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia menegaskan perlunya komitmen serantau yang lebih utuh dalam memperkukuh perlindungan kanak-kanak daripada ancaman dunia siber.

Timbalan Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Ahmad Zahid Hamidi berkata, usaha kolektif itu perlu digerakkan segera, memandangkan persekitaran digital kini membawa risiko yang berkembang lebih pantas daripada kemampuan negara untuk bertindak balas.

"Bahaya dalam talian tidak mengenal sempadan. Seorang pemangsa tidak memerlukan pasport. Video berbahaya tidak berhenti di pintu imigresen.

"Satu hantaran berbahaya boleh sampai ke sebelas negara ASEAN dalam beberapa minit, sebab itulah tindakan kolektif ASEAN bukan sahaja penting, ia adalah satu keperluan," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian ketika berucap pada Majlis Perasmian Forum ICT ASEAN 2025 mengenai perlindungan kanak-kanak dalam talian dan peluncuran Pelan Tindakan Dasar Kanak-Kanak Negara, di ibu negara, pagi tadi.

Menurutnya, beberapa negara di rantau ini turut merekodkan kebimbangan, termasuk 74 peratus pengguna di Singapura berusia 15 tahun ke atas berdepan kandungan berbahaya dalam talian pada 2024.

Manakala di negara ini, kira-kira 33 peratus golongan muda mengakui pernah menjadi mangsa pemulian siber.

Sehubungan itu, Malaysia mengusulkan tiga keutamaan serantau bagi memperkukuh perlindungan kanak-kanak di alam maya, antaranya rangkaian pertukaran maklumat perlindungan kanak-kanak, protokol forensik digital bersama dan kurikulum pemeliharaan digital.

"Inisiatif ini dapat dilaksanakan dengan segera, diperkemas dari semasa ke semasa dan diperluas secara bersama.

"Insya-Allah, usaha ini akan mendekatkan ASEAN untuk menjadi salah satu rantau digital paling selamat bagi kanak-kanak," ujarnya.

Pada majlis sama, beliau turut melancarkan Dasar Kanak-Kanak Kebangsaan dan Pelan Tindakan Kanak-Kanak (2026-2030) yang memberi fokus kepada hak dan keselamatan serta masa depan digital yang berdaya tahan.

Dasar yang dibangunkan Kementerian Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWK) itu, bagi memastikan kesejahteraan, kelangsungan hidup dan penyertaan holistik golongan itu selaras dengan prinsip Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC).

100,000 kanak-kanak terdedah penderaan seksual dalam talian

Teknologi moden memudahkan penjenayah ambil kesempatan eksploitasi mangsa

Kuala Lumpur: Seorang daripada empat kanak-kanak di Malaysia, secara tidak sengaja terdedah kepada kandungan seksual atau bahan yang menganggu dalam talian, manakala kira-kira 100,000 kanak-kanak menjadi mangsa eksploitasi atau penderaan seksual dalam talian setiap tahun.

Wakil Tabung Kanak-Kanak Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (UNICEF) ke Malaysia dan Brunei, Robert Gass, berkata situasi bahaya dihadapi kanak-kanak semakin meningkat ketika lanskap digital berkembang pesat di negara ini.

"Di Malaysia, seorang daripada empat kanak-kanak pernah 'terjumpa' dengan kandungan seksual atau menganggu dalam talian secara tawp dijangka.

"Kira-kira 100,000 kanak-kanak setiap tahun mengalami eksploitasi atau penderaan seksual dalam talian. Ini bersamaan seorang kanak-kanak dalam setiap bilik darjah," katanya ketika mendedahkan situasi itu dalam ucapan di Forum ICT ASEAN mengenai Perlindungan Kanak-Kanak Dalam Talian 2025, men-

Forum itu dirasmikan Timbalan Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi. Yang turut hadir Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWK), Datuk Seri Nancy Shuhri dan Timbalannya, Datuk Seri Dr Noraini Ahmad.

Gass berkata, bahan penganiayaan seksual kanak-kanak (CSAM) global meningkat sehingga 125 kali ganda pada tahun ini, dengan ramai kanak-kanak di Malaysia sangat terdedah dengan eksploitasi seksual sedemikian.

Beliau berkata, kira-kira 40,000 laporan mengenai CSAM pada separuh pertama 2025, me-

ningkat berbanding sekitar 7,000 laporan diterima pada tahun lalu, sekali gus mendahiri peningkatan 125 kali ganda dalam tempoh setahun saja.

"Trend global hari ini, menunjukkan laporan mengenai CSAM yang dijana kecerdasan buatan (AI) meningkat secara mendadak dengan 2024, hampir 7,000 laporan diterima tetapi meningkat kepada kira-kira 440,000 laporan hanya dalam separuh pertama 2025. Ini bersamaan peningkatan 125 kali ganda dalam tempoh setahun saja.

"Kes sextortion iaitu apabila kanak-kanak diperdaya atau dipaksa untuk berkongsi gambar intim dan kemudian diugut, juga semakin meningkat. Imej yang dijana AI sering digunakan da-

lam kes sebegini.

"Kita mengesan chatbot kini sudah belajar untuk menyalahgunakan perbualan seksual dan merajai imej CSAM," katanya.

Gass berkata, kanak-kanak di Malaysia turut terdedah dengan pencabulan seksual kanak-kanak dalam talian.

Menyentuh mengenai Isjaya Malaysia dalam melindungi kanak-kanak, Gass berkata, pelbagai inisiatif dan program dijayakan untuk mewujudkan ruang dalam talian yang selamat untuk golongan berkenaan.

"Langkah penting yang dijalankan hari ini, iaitu pelancaran Pelan Tindakan Perlindungan Kanak-Kanak Kebangsaan, yang diterajui oleh Timbalan Perdana Menteri dilatih UNICEF sebagai

antara usaha memperkukuh perlindungan untuk kanak-kanak dalam talian, selain mengukuhkan kepimpinan Malaysia dalam mewujudkan persekitaran digital yang melindungi setiap kanak-kanak berkembang maju," katanya.

Kes lebih banyak dari dilapor
Sementara itu, Nancy mengukuhkan kes pencabulan seksual kanak-kanak dalam talian di negara ini meningkat ke tahap yang amat membimbangkan.

Beliau berkata, Kementerian-punya (laporan CSAM terbaharu) harus datang daripada Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) dan KPWK belum memperoleh data baharu itu. Bagaimanapun, kita percaya peningkatan ini disebabkan kesedaran yang ada iaitu laporan-laporan ditemukakan mangsa.

Tingkat keselamatan digital negara

Kuala Lumpur: Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi memberi amaran bahaya alam siber kini sudah memperlemba ramai kanak-kanak serantau, termasuk Malaysia dalam pelbagai jenayah, khususnya kesalahan seksual.

Timbalan Perdana Menteri berkata, jaringan keselamatan dalam talian kini sedang berada pada tahap gasing disebabkan kemunculan pelbagai teknologi maju seperti kecerdasan buatan (AI) yang menjadikan kanak-kanak sebagai mangsa.

Beliau memberi ingatan, dunia digital sememangnya menawarkan peluang tetapi turut membuka risiko yang berkembang lebih pantas daripada kemampuan kita untuk bertindak balas.

"Di seluruh ASEAN, kita sedang melihat tanda-tanda amaran,

antaranya Singapura, sebagai contoh, 74 peratus pengguna internet berusia 16 tahun ke atas sudah memperlemba dengan kandungan berbahaya dalam talian pada 2024, manakala di Malaysia, tinjauan menunjukkan sekitar 53 peratus anak muda menjadi mangsa buli siber.

"In bukan sekadar angka tetapi adalah isyarat bahawa jaringan keselamatan sedia ada kita sedang berada pada tahap gasing kerana AI kini membolehkan pemangsa meniputi suara, memalsukan wajah, menipulasi identiti kanak-kanak. Ini dibuktikan dari belakang skrin, tanpa perlu berada dalam bilik yang sama.

"Di Malaysia, melalui hasrat amat jelas, Saruhannya Komunikasi dan Multimedia (MCMC) mencatatkan sekitar 9,000 aduan buli siber pada 2024, dengan pa-

rada 27 kes setiap hari," katanya ketika berucap pada pelancaran Forum ICT ASEAN 2025 mengenai Perlindungan Online Kanak-Kanak, di sini semalam.

Yang turut hadir ialah Menteri Pembangunan Wanita, Keluarga dan Masyarakat (KPWK), Datuk Seri Nancy Shuhri dan Timbalannya, Datuk Seri Dr Noraini Ahmad, serta Wakil Tabung Kanak-Kanak, Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (UNICEF) ke Malaysia dan Wakil Unicef ke Brunei, Robert Gass.

100,000 budak mangsa eksploitasi seksual dalam talian setiap tahun

Jaga menangis dituduh cabul murid

Melaka: Pengawal keselamatan menangis tersedak-esak ketika dihadapkan ke Mahkamah Sesyen Ayer Keroh, di sini, semalam, atas pertuduhan melakukan amang seksual terhadap seorang pelajar lelaki di tandas sebuah sekolah menengah, di sini, minggu lalu.

Ibrahim Dini, 59, kelihatan menangis dan mengesat air matanya dengan tuala kecil sewaktu bercajak dengan isterinya selepas prosiding berakhir.

Terdahulu, warga emas itu mengaku tidak bersalah sejurus dibacakan pertuduhan oleh jurubahasa mahkamah di hadapan Hakim Rohatul Akmar Abdullah.

Mengikut pertuduhan, dia didakwa sengaja melakukan amang seksual fizikal terhadap mangsa berusia 13 tahun itu di dalam tandas murid lelaki di sekolah berkenaan pada 11 November lalu, jam 1.23 tengah hari.

Dia didakwa melakukan kesalahan Seksyen 14 (a) Akta Kesalahan-Kesalahan Seksual Terhadap Kanak-Kanak 2017, jika disabitkan boleh dipenjarakan maksimum 20 tahun dan

sebatan.

Sementara itu, Timbalan Pendakwa Raya Nor Asnini Kamarudin mencadangkan tertuduh dilepaskan dengan jaminan RM20,000 sementara menunggu perbicaraan kes selesai.

Peguam, Mohammad Arifin Abdul Wahab merayu jaminan paling minimum atas beberapa alasan termasuk tertuduh bakal hilang kerja susulan pertuduhan dihadapinya serta menanggung keluarga termasuk anak belum bekerja dan ibu kandung berusia 76 tahun.

Katanya, jika diberhentikan tertuduh bergantung sepenuhnya kepada pencajen RM900 sebulan selain isterinya seorang guru KAF dengan pendapatan RM2,300 sebulan.

Mahkamah kemudian membenarkan tertuduh diikat jamin RM9,000 dengan seorang penjamin berserta syarat tambahan dilarang mengganggu mangsa dan melaporkan diri di balai polis berdekatan setiap bulan.

Mahkamah menetapkan 6 Januari depan untuk sebutan semula kes bagi serahan dokumen.

TELUK INTAN – Seorang pemandu jentera berat mengaku bersalah di Mahkamah Sesyen di sini hari ini atas 11 pertuduhan kesalahan seksual termasuk merogol, meliwat dan amang seksual fizikal ke atas anak tirinya yang berusia 14 tahun.

Pengakuan bersalah itu dibuat tertuduh berusia 41 tahun selepas semua pertuduhan dibacakan jurubahasa di hadapan Hakim Gan Peng Kun.

Mengikut pertuduhan pertama hingga keempat, bapa empat anak itu didakwa merogol mangsa yang mana perhubungan itu tidak dibenarkan di bawah undang-undang, hukum agama, adat dan kebiasaan yang terpakai untuk berkahwin.

Kesalahan dilakukan di sebuah rumah dalam daerah Bagan Datuk pada 5 dan 25 September serta 7 dan 29 Oktober 2025. Pertuduhan dibuat mengikut Seksyen 376(3) Kanun Keseksaan yang membawa hukuman penjara maksimum 30 tahun dan tidak kurang 10 sebatan.

Tertuduh turut didakwa atas tiga tuduhan iaitu dengan sengaja melakukan persetubuhan yang bertentangan aturan tabii, amang seksual fizikal terhadap mangsa di lokasi dan tarikh yang sama selain memiliki 20 video pornografi kanak-kanak di dalam sebuah telefon bimbit jenama Oppo.

Kesalahan itu dilakukan di lokasi sama pada pukul 12.15 tengah hari, 11 November lalu. – KOSMO! ONLINE

Ujar Norhisham lagi, suspek kini telah ditahan reman selama enam hari bermula hari ini hingga 23 November dan polis telah merampas kenderaan yang digunakan ketika kejadian.

Menurutnya, turut dirampas telefon bimbit beserta dua keping simkad dan kes disiasat di bawah Seksyen 14(a) Akta Kesalahan-Kesalahan Seksual Terhadap Kanak-Kanak 2017. –
